SEC. 5-1-1 EMERGENCY GOVERNMENT JOINT ACTION ORDINANCE.

- (a) **Joint Action Ordinance** A joint action ordinance providing for a county-municipal joint action emergency government organization adopted by the Outagamie County Board of Supervisors on the 11th day of July, 1972, as County Code Chapter 6, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof by reference (Appendix A), is hereby ratified and accepted by the Village of Nichols, Outagamie County, State of Wisconsin.
- (b) **Ratification.** This ratification and acceptance of the joint ordinance and code shall constitute a mutual agreement between the Village of Nichols, and the County of Outagamie.

6.01 INTRODUCTION.

This chapter is included to prepare the County and municipalities to cope with emergencies resulting from enemy action and natural or man-made disasters, as set out in Sec. 22.16, Wis. Stats. In addition, the County Board of Supervisors does hereby adopt the Wisconsin Emergency Operations Plan as amended and issued March 1971.

6.02 DEFINITIONS.

(1) **Emergency Government.** Emergency government includes civil defense and means all measures undertaken by or on behalf of the County and its municipalities; to prepare for and minimize the effects of enemy action and natural or man-made disasters upon the civilian population and to effectuate emergency repairs to or the emergency restoration of vital public utilities and facilities destroyed or damaged by such action or disaster.

(2) **Civil Defense.** Civil defense means all measures undertaken by or on behalf of the County and municipalities to prepare for and minimize the effect of enemy action upon the civilian population.

(3) **Enemy Action.** Enemy action means hostile action by a foreign power which threatens the security of the County or a portion thereof.

6.03 COUNTY HEAD OF EMERGENCY GOVERNMENT SERVICES.

The County Executive shall be the head of Emergency Government Services and shall be subject to the policy and rules making of the County Emergency Government Committee.
